Judging Requirements

It is emphasised that the following criteria is to be regarded as the absolute minimum and inclusion on the various lists is at the discretion of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society Committee

REQUIREMENTS FOR INCLUSION ARE:-

List A1

For judges who have previously been approved by the Kennel Club to give CCs in the breed and have completed their first appointment. To have the support of the Central & Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society.

List A2

For judges who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with the Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support of the Central & Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society

List A3 [Breed Specialist]

All judges the C & S GSP Society would support to award Kennel Club Challenge Certificates but are not yet approved by the Kennel Club providing they fulfil all the requirements of the B List and who have all the requirements listed below:-

- 1. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed.
- 2. The Society would look favourably on those who have judged a GSP Breed Club Open Show.
- 3. To have judged the breed at a minimum of 10 Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs with a good geographical spread.
- 4. To have judged a minimum of 30 classes.
- 5. To have judged at least 70 dogs in this breed.
- 6. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and Judging Procedures.
- 7. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Confirmation and Movement.
- 8. To have attended at least one Breed Specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the MCE and hands on assessment where applicable.
- 9. To have attended a Confirmation and Movement 'Hands on Assessment' (Points of the Dog) conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
- 10. To have stewarded a minimum of 12 times. [Stewarding at a Championship Show or Open Show on each day counts as separate stewarding sessions].
- 11. To have attended an Open HPR Field Trial or Working Test.
- 12. To have bred/owned a minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book [save in exceptional circumstances].
- 13. Must have the support of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society.

List A3 [Non-Breed Specialist]

All judges the C & S GSP Society would support to award Kennel Club Challenge Certificates but are not yet approved by the Kennel Club providing they fulfil all the requirements of the B List and who have all the requirements listed below:-

- 1. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in any one breed [to include 5 years in this breed].
- 2. The Society would look favourably on those who have judged a GSP Breed Club Open Show.
- 3. To have judged the breed at a minimum of 10 Open Shows or Championship Shows without CCs with a good geographical spread.
- 4. To have judged a minimum of 30 classes.
- 5. To have judged at least 70 dogs in this breed.
- 6. To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed.
- 7. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Confirmation and Movement.
- 8. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and Judging Procedures.

- 9. To have attended at least one Breed Specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the MCE and hands on assessment where applicable.
- 10.To have attended a Hands On Assessment (Points of the Dog) seminar, given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
- 11. To have stewarded a minimum of 12 times. [Stewarding at a Championship Show or Open Show on each day counts as separate stewarding sessions].
- 12. To have attended an Open HPR Field Trial or Working Test (first time CC judges)
- 13. To have bred/owned a minimum of 3 dogs in any breed when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book [save in exceptional circumstances].
- 14. Must have the support of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society.

List B [Breed Specialist]

For those who have had an active involvement in the Breed for a minimum of 5 years

- 1. Met the Requirements of the C List Criteria
- 2. To have a minimum of 5 years judging experience in the breed.
- 3. To have judged a minimum of 3 Open Shows with a good geographical spread and entry.
- 4. To have judged at least 7 classes, of this breed, at Open or Championship Shows without CCs.
- 5. To have judged at least 20 dogs in this breed.
- 6. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice.
- 7. To have stewarded a minimum of 3 times. [Stewarding at a Championship Show or Open Show on each day counts as separate stewarding sessions].
- 8. To have attended a Confirmation and Movement 'Hands on Assessment' (Points of the Dog) conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
- 9. Must have the support of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society.

List B [Non-Breed Specialist]

- 1. Met the Requirements of the C List Criteria
- 2. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in any one breed.
- 3. To have judged a minimum of 4 Open Shows with a good geographical spread and entry.
- 4. To have judged at least 7 classes, of this breed at Open or Championship Shows without CCs.
- 5. To have judged at least 20 dogs in this breed.
- 6. To have stewarded a minimum of 3 times. [Stewarding at a Championship Show or Open Show on each day counts as separate stewarding sessions].
- 7. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar in the last 7 years run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
- 8. To have attended a Confirmation & Movement, 'Hands On Assessment' (Points of the Dog) seminar, given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
- 9. Must have the support of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society.

List C

For all judges within the Breed who have the support of the Central and Southern German Shorthaired Pointer Society to judge at a Limited or Open Show.

- 1. Minimum of 5 years proven interest in pedigree dogs.
- 2. Attend a Requirements of a Dog Show Judge seminar (but not mandatory to take and pass examination).
- 3. Attend a Conformation and Movement seminar.
- 4. Complete a minimum of 2 stewarding appointments.
